

Funded by the National Institutes of Health (NIH), the \$80 million RADx-UP grant aims to reduce health inequities by increasing access to COVID-19 testing in communities most affected by the pandemic. As co-lead of the RADx-UP Coordination and Data Collection Center (CDCC) Community Engagement Core, CCPH supports a community-engaged, participatory infrastructure designed to center the experiences and perspectives of diverse communities in COVID-19 testing and research.
